

To the Honorable Mayor & Alderman of
the City of Cambridge
Gentlemen

The undersigned
respectfully represents that when Raymond Street was laid out
through his land it was understood that the same should not
be built until the public good required it. Believing as he does
that the public good does not yet require the further extension of
Raymond Street as laid out, but would be otherwise better accom-
modated at present, he would respectfully request that a
street be laid out from the present westerly finished ter-
minus of Raymond Street over lands of his own and
Millard's across the bridge over the Boston & Fitchburg
R.R. to North Avenue coming out at Atwill Store, and also
at Raymond St. connecting with a street already laid out
leading to Mount Auburn.

And provided he be released from building any part
of Raymond Street for the further time of five years, he agrees
on his part in connection with said Millard to construct and
build said new street (if laid out) within ninety days, and also
when the City accept the same as a public street he agrees to
assign over to the City a bond whereby the Boston and Fitchburg
R.R. agree to maintain said bridge forever.
