Petition of New England Telephone and Telegraph Company for determination by the Department that public convenience and necessity require locations in a portion of a public street in the care and control of the Metropolitan District Commission in the city of Cambridge.

This is a petition of the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company under the provisions of section 43 of Chapter 92 of the General Laws for a determination that public convenience and necessity require locations in a boulevard in the care and control of the Metropolitan District Commission, namely, Msgr. O'Brien Highway at East and Cambridge Streets in the City of Cambridge for seventy feet of underground conduit to be used for the transmission of intelligence by electricity.

The petitioner is a corporation organized under the laws of the state of New York and is a public service corporation engaged in the transmission of intelligence by electricity throughout the Commonwealth and several of the New England states.

On the above matter a public hearing was held at the State House on July 13, 1961 at which time all parties of interest were given an opportunity to be heard and no one appeared in opposition.

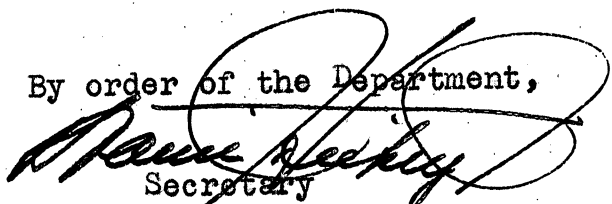
Existing cable facilities in the area are not adequate to meet present requirements and additional cable facilities are necessary to provide telephone service to an Industrial Park under construction in the area. Initial service will be to the Shawmut Plate Glass Company.

After notice, a public hearing, consideration and under all circumstances, the Department is of the opinion that the locations applied for are necessary for the transmission of intelligence by electricity by the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Accordingly, the Department

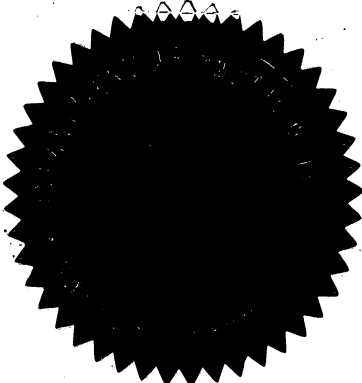
FINDS, by Order, that the location for one buried cable, approximately seventy feet in length, in the Msgr. O'Brien Highway at the junction of East and Cambridge Streets in the city of Cambridge all substantially as shown on a New England Telephone and Telegraph Company plan, #05-643, and further identified as Exhibit 1, a copy of which is on file with the petition, are required by public convenience and necessity for the transmission of intelligence by electricity.

APPEAL CLAUSE

AN APPEAL AS TO MATTERS OF LAW FROM ANY FINAL DECISION, ORDER OR RULING OF THE COMMISSION MAY BE TAKEN TO THE SUPREME JUDICIAL COURT BY AN AGGRIEVED PARTY IN INTEREST BY THE FILING OF A WRITTEN PETITION PRAYING THAT THE ORDER OF THE COMMISSION BE MODIFIED OR SET ASIDE IN WHOLE OR IN PART.

SUCH PETITION FOR APPEAL SHALL BE FILED WITH THE SECRETARY OF THE COMMISSION WITHIN TWENTY DAYS AFTER THE DATE OF THE DECISION, ORDER OR RULING OF THE COMMISSION, OR WITHIN SUCH FURTHER TIME AS THE COMMISSION MAY ALLOW UPON REQUEST FILED PRIOR TO THE EXPIRATION OF TWENTY DAYS AFTER THE DECISION, ORDER OR RULING.
