In Board of Aldermen, *Apr 20* 1887

Ordered,

That the Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges be authorized and directed to cause stone crossings to be laid across Linnaean Shepard and Wallace Streets in line with the sidewalk on the northerly side of Garden Street, and that the Committee be authorized to cause circular edge stones to be set to meet said crossings, as follows: - at each corner of Wallace and Garden Streets, and on the northerly corner of Linnaean and Garden Street,

The cost of materials furnished for said edgestones to be assessed upon the owners of abutting estates according to law. The expense of the foregoing to be charged to the appropriation for Street Department, (Paving).

The Committee on Roads and Bridges of this board,
to which was referred the petition of E. S. Dixwell and others
praying for stone crossings on the north side of Garden
street at Linnaean, Shepard, Wallace and Chauncy streets
and across Follen street in line with sidewalk on the north
side of Concord Avenue, Reports,

Recommending the adoption of accompanying order for crossings as prayed for
on Garden street, at Linnaean, Shepard and Wallace
streets, and also for edge stones where needed to meet
such crossings. The cost of such edgestones to be assessed
according to law.

Upon so much of the aforesaid petition as relates
to crossings over Chauncy and Follen streets, your
Committee recommends that the petitioners have leave
to withdraw.
