Stephen H. Mahoney served the City of Cambridge as Superintendent of Recreation from 1923 until his retirement in 1956 and became recognized as an authority in this field who pioneered many new endeavors in his chosen field, and

Stephen H. Mahoney graduated from Boston College and successfully served as football coach at Boston College High School, Somerville High School and Boston College prior to his appointment as Assistant Headmaster at Somerville High School and also served as intercollegiate football official for twenty-five years, and

Mahoney revolved around the fields of athletics and recreation, he was active in fraternal affairs having served as Kiwanis Club President, Massachusetts Recreation Association and St. Peter's Holy Name Society and achieved recognition in the field of literature by his many contributions to Parking and Recreation Publications and his publication of a series of religious poems entitled "Our Queen and Other Poems" therefore be it
