

City of Cambridge.

In the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six.

An Ordinance,  
to establish a City Seal.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the  
City of Cambridge, as follows:

That a view, in  
distant perspective, of the City of Cambridge  
and the City of Boston, united by a bridge, and  
having on the extreme right the towers of Gore  
Hall and on the extreme left the dome of the  
State House, shall be the device of the City Seal.  
The motto, round the device, shall be as follows,  
to wit: "Litteris antiquis, novis institutis, decora";  
and the inscription shall be as follows, to wit:  
"Cambridge, condita A.D. 1630: civico regimine  
donata A.D. 1846."
