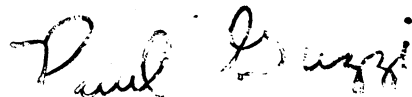

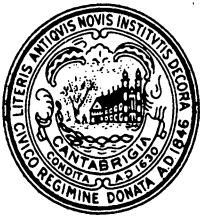

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

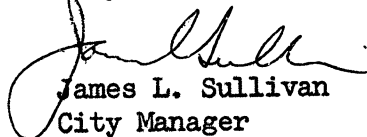
