WHEREAS The arts and humanities, in all of their forms, undeniably and invaluabley enhance and enrich the lives of all citizens; and

WHEREAS: The arts and humanities affect every aspect of life in our cities today, including the economy and job creation, education, social issues, quality of life, and community building; and

WHEREAS: Local arts agencies across the country have joined the National Assembly of Local Arts Agencies (NALAA), the National Assembly of State Arts Agencies, and a coalition of over fifty national arts and humanities organizations representing over 23,000 cultural organizations, to form the National Cultural Alliance to develop a long term public awareness campaign on the availability and importance of the arts and humanities to all Americans; and

WHEREAS: The public awareness campaign theme, "The Arts and Humanities: There is Something in It For You," was introduced to the public in 1993 and will be ongoing for three years; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council shall designate the month of October 1994 as "Arts and Humanities Month;" and be it further

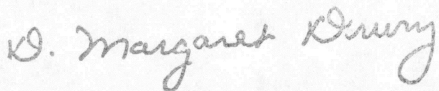
