- WHEREAS: Before the time she joined the Council on Aging, Blois belonged to its Advisory Council for two years; and
- WHEREAS: Blois also served the Council on Aging as a delegate to its Health Task Force from 1979 to 1983; and
- WHEREAS: Blois enhanced her qualifications for service of the elderly by completing the University of Massachusetts Gerontology Program in 1980; and
- WHEREAS: This outstanding Cambridge citizen served the City as Assistant Coordinator of the Russell and Peabody Community Schools from 1970 to 1973; and
- WHEREAS: Blois served the youth of her own Christ Church as a Sunday school teacher for fourteen years; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its thanks and appreciation to Blois Purcell for her dedication to the citizens of Cambridge, old and young; and be it further
