- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Sister Mary Priscilla McDonough late co-director of the Healing and Restoration Ministry of Boston and resident of Saint Peter's Convent, Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Sister entered the convent in 1941 and professed her vows from the School Sisters of Notre Dame in 1943, as well as receiving a bachelor's degree in education from Boston College; and
- WHEREAS: During the past 15 years she, along with her brother, the Reverend Edward J. McDonough has managed seminars and retreats as well as healing services throughout most states within the United States and other countries; and
- WHEREAS: Prior to her work in the ministry, Sister served as both a teacher and principal in Catholic schools in Massachusetts, New York, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New Hampshire and Vermont; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of Sister Mary Priscilla McDonough at their time of such personal loss and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Council be and hereby is requested to forward a suitable resolution to her brother, Reverend Edward J. McDonough on behalf of the entire City Council.
