

To the Hon Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City
of Cambridge.

Gentlemen.

The undersigned owners and residents
on North Avenue, would respectfully represent, that in 1869 edgestones were
set on both sides of said Avenue, from Church Street to the Railroad Bridge,
that in 1870 a brick sidewalk was laid on the easterly side, and in 1871
edgestones and brick sidewalks were laid on both sides of said Avenue, above
the Railroad Bridge to Rice Street, leaving portions of the sidewalks on the
westerly side, between Church St and said Bridge not completed.

Wherefore the undersigned would hereby petition your Honorable
Board, that a brick sidewalk may be laid over this portion of said
Avenue as above, believing that the public convenience and
necessity will be subserved, as well as the general appearance
of this prominent thoroughfare of the City greatly improved
