- WHEREAS: At this time exchange between the United States and the Soviet Union blossoms in the positive light of interest, hope, and greatly relaxed tensions and when it is recognized that learning, language, travel, and friendships across borders not only educate but bond people; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council hereby warmly welcomes the students of Yaroslavl' in mid-April and enthusiastically encourages the students from C.R.L.S. as they continue their fund raising preparation; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That herewith, we urge the businesses, institutions, and individuals of our City to give their help in goods, services and financial support in response to this message and to the varied fund raising efforts made by the C.R.L.S. Russian Club students and their supporters; and be it further
- RESOLVED: Finally, we look forward to the return of our students and their bringing their experiences, in return, back to our city; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the C.R.L.S. Russian Club on behalf of the entire City Council.
