- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Arthur E. "Bud" Savage, owner of a tax accounting business in Central Square for thirty-six years; and
- WHEREAS: Bud, born in Cambridge, moved to Hull in 1941 before returning to Cambridge in 1971, graduated from Rindge Technical High School and attended Tufts University, and also a graduate of the American Institute of Accounting; and
- WHEREAS: A former member of Local 5-935 Musicians Union and a member of the Nantascot Lodge of Masons, Bud was also a member of the M.A.P.A., the N.S.P.A., and a past member of the Amicable Lodge of Masons and the Allepo Shrine; and
- WHEREAS: Bud, an accomplished pianist, was known to many elderly, especially to those at the Truman Apartments and at 15 Pearl Street, for his talent and his giving nature, especially at tax time when he helped so many of them with their taxes; and
- WHEREAS: Bud, the husband of the late Janet E. Savage-Whittier, will be sadly missed by his four children, Bruce, Deane, Gregg, and Janet M. Flanagan, his sister Evelyn Veale, and his five grandchildren; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire Savage family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Savage family on behalf of the entire City Council.
