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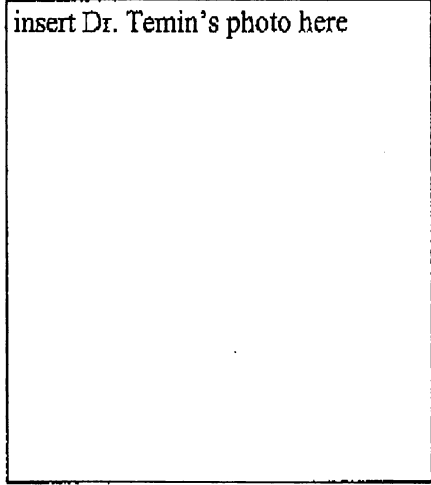

Dr. Temin began her career as a teacher in the New York City Public School System. Upon earning her master's degree from Hunter College, she became a guidance counselor at Hunter College High School. Dr. Temin came to The Guidance Center for the first time in 1972, while she was studying for her doctorate degree in counseling psychology at Harvard University. She remained at GCI, serving as a senior psychologist until 1982. One of her first projects at GCI was the development of the *Companion Tutor Program*, which matches college students with children who are seen at the agency for behavioral and/or emotional issues. Dr. Temin designed the program to be mutually beneficial. It gives college students the opportunity to gain experience working with children and has a therapeutic effect on the children. The Companion Tutor Program was the basis for Dr. Temin's doctoral thesis, titled, "A Study of the Growth and Development of College-Age Volunteers in a Supervised Companion Tutoring Program." The program continues to thrive and is now in its 29th year. The longevity of the Companion Tutor Program, as well as its uniqueness in partnering two distinct populations, are two of the reasons that Dr. Temin calls it "one of my proudest accomplishments."

Dr. Temin returned to The Guidance Center in 1992 as a member of the Board of Directors, and served as President from 1995-1997. During this time, she led the agency through a strategic planning process and into its affiliation with Center, Inc., creating The

In addition to her work at The Guidance Center, Dr. Temin has engaged in private clinical practice since 1979, treating families and couples with systemic and psychodynamic therapies. Her practice includes treatment of individuals with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder; adult children of alcoholics; people struggling with depression, anxiety disorders, adjustment disorders and some major mental disorders.

Although she is a psychologist, Dr. Temin has not abandoned her first profession as educator. She completed a teaching fellowship at the Harvard Graduate School of Education and served as a visiting instructor at Hebrew University in Jerusalem. Since 1987, she has been a clinical instructor in Psychology with the Department of Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Temin has taught courses in multiple family therapy theories; family evaluation (including violence, child abuse and post traumatic stress disorder); object relations theory and practice; narrative theory and practice; social class and culture; and ethics and psychotherapy. Her students include practicing psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers and psychiatric nurses. Additionally as a member of the Executive Committee of the Couples and Family Center, Harvard Medical School at The Cambridge Hospital, Dr. Temin was involved in curriculum development for the program and participated in interviewing and hiring faculty members.

Dr. Temin is a member of Kappa Delta Pi, Education Honor Society, Hunter College Chapter and Pi Lambda Theta, Graduate Honor Society, Harvard University Chapter.

I oversaw the operation of the Cambridge Guidance Center operated by the Cambridge Mental Health Association. I shepherded the transition of the Board from an inactive rubber stamp to an activist, fund-raising Board that became influential in the operation of the Guidance Center.
- 1986-98 Member of the Executive Committee of the Couples and Family Center, Harvard Medical School at The Cambridge Hospital
I was involved in program and curriculum development for this training and service operation. I participated in interviewing and hiring faculty members. I dealt with ethical issues that arose in the program.
- 1972-78 Psychologist, Cambridge Guidance Center
I developed a para-professional training-mentoring program in which college students and young adults in the community worked with disturbed children who were at the Cambridge Guidance Center. They acted as companion therapists. I designed the program, recruited the mentors, matched them to children, and supervised the volunteers in weekly small groups. This program was unique in the effort devoted to ongoing supervision and training of the companion therapists. The program still continues in operation and is funded by the United Way.
- 1968 Consultant to Holliston, Massachusetts, school system
I was an advisor to the new Pupil Personnel Director in this suburban school system in the training of staff and program development.
- 1967 Advisor to the Weston, Massachusetts, school system
I advised the school system in the process of developing a vision of a suburban guidance program.
- 1966 Harvard University, Cambridge Massachusetts
Administrative Assistant to the Committee on Pupil Personnel Services
This was a Harvard-based committee that worked with Pupil Personnel

Directors of neighboring cities to develop guidance programs in the schools.

- 1965 Harvard University, Harvard-Boston Program
Faculty member of a program between Harvard and the Boston School System designed to initiate and encourage the development of a guidance program for the Boston schools. In addition to teaching, I developed an outreach component in which I led small groups of inner-city parents to discuss their own problems with their children and the schools. The outreach program was designed to help parents feel more empowered in their relationship with the school system.
- 1954-58 Board of Education, New York City
During the 1950s, there was a wave of immigration from Puerto Rico who attended the New York City public schools. Two other teachers and I responded to the problems facing these children and their parents by developing the first guidance program in the elementary schools in New York City. We focused on the problems of malnutrition, acculturation, and communication issues. We visited the homes of every child in the school whose parents would receive us and developed a group of parents who spoke some English, had leadership potential, and would reach out to other parents. We connected them to nutrition experts from the New York City Board of Health and formulated and supervised a three-session workshop on nutrition and how it affected learning.

My practice includes treatment of people with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, adult children of alcoholics, students unable to complete dissertations (that is, writing blocks), people struggling with severe depression and anxiety disorders, people with adjustment disorders, and some major mental disorders.
