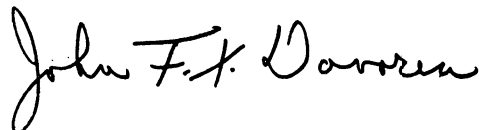

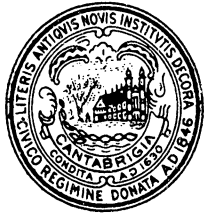
CHINESE GOLDEN AGE CENTER, INC.

The purposes of this corporation shall be to promote the general welfare of the elderly.

The purposes shall be confined to that which is solely educational, charitable and benevolent under Massachusetts law and statutes and no part of the earnings shall inure to the benefit of any private individual. No part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise directly influencing legislation or intervention in any political campaign. In the event of dissolution the corporation's property shall be applied to charitable purposes in accordance with the doctrine of cy pres in all respects as a court having jurisdiction in the premises may direct.

The corporation shall have the power to do any and all things necessary, desirable, incidental or convenient to its purposes not inconsistent with laws affecting non-profit corporations.

The corporation shall in no way operate otherwise than exclusively for educational and charitable purposes as shall qualify the corporation for exemption from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as now in force or hereafter amended; and no amendment of the By-Laws or the Articles of Organization shall be effective to authorize otherwise.

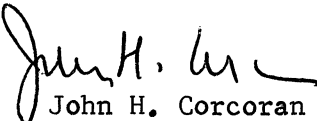
