MARCH 23, 1987

- WHEREAS: It is projected that, by 1991, close to two hundred thousand Americans will have died of AIDS and millions will be infected; and
- WHEREAS: This disease requires many different kinds of responses, from human compassion to sophisticated medical research; and
- WHEREAS: Some of the responses to the concern of the spread of AIDS can and should be appropriately addressed within our City; therefore, be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager appoint an AIDS Task Force; and be it further
- ORDERED: That this Task Force comprise City personnel and citizens, including health professionals, educators, civil rights advocates (including those concerned with the handicapped), members of high risk groups, and employers; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the AIDS Task Force look at the risk to the Cambridge population; the need for additional public policy; the adequacy of health facilities and of health, mental health, and other services; the adequacy of education about AIDS and the best routes for increased education to Cambridge children, teenagers, and adults; enforcement of non-discrimination and confidentiality laws; the need for an on-going Task Force; and any other issues the committee deems relevant; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the Task Force be asked to report back to the City Manager and the City Council in a timely fashion.
