It was with profound sorrow that this City Council learned of the passing of Kenneth W. Goepper on Friday, December 24, 1971 at the age of seventy-three, and

WHEREAS:-

Kenneth W. Goepper was appointed a teacher at Rindge Technical School in 1922 after his graduation from Harvard College and served as Master of the Fletcher School in 1937, the Wallington School in 1945, the Agassiz School in 1960 and the New Morse School in 1965 until his retirement in 1968, and

WHEREAS:-

Kenneth W. Goepper after his graduation from Harvard College in 1920, received his LLB from Northeastern University in 1924 and his Master of Education degree from Boston University in 1930, and was active in fraternal circles as a member of the Knights of Columbus, the Cambridge Elks, the Bar Association and the Massachusetts School Masters' Organization and served his country as an Army Veteran of World War I, and

WHEREAS:-

He was admired for his sound judgment, exceptional administrative abilities and loved for his fairness and generosity, his high sense of honor and his constant devotion to the school children of the City of Cambridge, and

WHEREAS:-

His passing will be sorely felt by the members of his family and his many friends and associates in the field of education, therefore be it
