WHEREAS: On June 28, 1910 in County Cork, Ireland a child was born whose life would embody the story of the immigrants who came to the United States, contributed immensely to the richness of our communities while, at the same time, holding on to the richness of their ethnic roots. That child is our friend, neighbor and sister-citizen in Cambridge, Margaret "Madge" Doherty who has lived as a resident of Gurney Street for fifty years; and

WHEREAS: Having arrived in the United States in 1927, she and her husband were married in 1936 and, as parents of two daughters, created a family where the phrase "family values" was not a superficial slick slogan but was a belief of substance to which they were committed. Her daughters Margaret Lawson and Eileen McConville have continued commitment to that belief with the result that today, Margaret "Madge" Doherty is the grandmother of eight grandchildren (4 boys and 4 girls) who light up her life; and

WHEREAS: Her closeness to her roots in County Cork is kept alive by contact with her sister and brother who still live there, that closeness is emphasized in a special way as Margaret "Madge" Doherty prepares to celebrate her 80th Birthday on June 28, 1990; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council extends congratulations and Birthday Greetings to Margaret "Madge" Doherty as she celebrates 80 years of life lived to the fullest; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to the honoree at the time of the public celebration of her birthday in the company of her family and friends.
