
This communication is in regards to our past telephone conversation with your office, and Mr. Charles Sullivan, Cambridge Historical Commission.

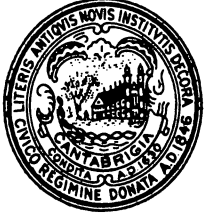

To the Honorable, the City Council:


