- WHEREAS: Founded in 1909 in the Agassiz neighborhood of Cambridge, Lesley has been known as a "college" for many years; and
- WHEREAS: Over the past two decades Lesley's array of programs has broadened, while its geographic reach and enrollment have increased dramatically; and
- WHEREAS: Today, Lesley is comprised of six distinct schools, offering undergraduate and graduate degrees to more than 8,000 women and men, not only at its Cambridge campus but at more than 150 remote sites in 15 states; and
- WHEREAS: This year, Lesley began offering its second Ph.D program, satisfying the final regulatory requirement of two doctoral programs necessary for becoming a "university" in Massachusetts; and
- WHEREAS: On September 5, 2000 a ceremony was held to publicly announce Lesley College name change to Lesley University; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council congratulate Lesley University on this milestone in its history, acknowledging the school's longstanding and extensive record of community service in the city and welcoming Cambridge's newest university; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Lesley University on behalf of the entire City Council.
