To The Honorable, The City Council:

Attached you will find Home Rule Legislation to allow the temporary appointment of Mr. Edward Corey to a position of Laborer in the Public Works Department. Mr. Corey was employed as a temporary laborer in the Public Works Department, in a provisional capacity, pending certification of an eligible list when, on Feb. 2, 1989 he suffered a very serious on the job injury, which resulted in lengthy hospitalization, surgery and a long period of incapacity. While he was out injured, his name was certified from a civil service eligible list for appointment. He was reachable on the list certified February 27, 1989, but, because of the injury he was not appointed due to medical disqualification.

After he recovered from his injuries he was reemployed provisionally and the City was desirous of appointing him, after certification to the temporary position he missed due to the injury. However, in the interim his position on the list slipped substantially due primarily to newly registered veterans and he is no longer in a reachable position.

The City believes the equitable solution is to appoint Mr. Corey to the position to which he would have been appointed, had the injury, suffered in service to the City, not temporarily disqualified him at the time. The attached legislation gives him civil service status as a temporary laborer back to the date he would have been appointed (that is, the same date other individuals were appointed from the list on which he was certified). This legislation will give him rights no greater or lesser than the rights he would now have had he been appointed at that time.

This action will take no opportunities away from other persons, as the City would not look to fill such a position again on a temporary basis.

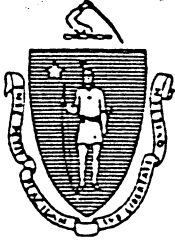
