- WHEREAS: During Mr. Kelleher's thirty-six year tenure he has played a key role in the conversion from manual to computer processing of water bills and all the intricacies related thereto; and
- WHEREAS: Joe Kelleher will be missed by his friends and colleagues who he has worked with for so many years; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our deepest gratitude and appreciation to Joseph B. Kelleher for his many years of loyal and dedicated public service and further to wish he and his wife, Dorothy, a happy and healthy retirement; and be it further
