The undersigned, owner of the entire area of land proposed to be included in the change to the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Cambridge as contemplated by the capitulation petition, hereby protest against such change pursuant to G.L. c. 40A §7 and G.L. c. 40A §5 as added by Chapter 808 of the Acts of 1975, for the reasons that the proposed change would constitute spot zoning and a taking of property without compensation and that such change would impermissibly restrict the use of land for proper educational purposes in violation of the so-called Dover Amendment, as contained in G.L. c. 40A §2 and G.L. c. 40A §3 as added by said Chapter 808.
