To the Honorable, the City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of \$80,000 in the Public Investment Fund Library Department Extraordinary Expenditures Account, to fund additional studies necessary for the main library siting process. These funds will come from Free Cash, and will be used to conduct a feasibility study and additional analysis for the construction of a new main library at 65 Prospect Street.

If the City Council were to decide to site the main library at 65 Prospect Street, several additional pieces of information need be gathered before a negotiated eminent domain purchase could take place. This includes investigations of geotechnical and geoenvironmental conditions, additional analysis on urban design, traffic, interim parking and zoning for this parcel as well as the parking lot across the street on Bishop Allen Drive, title/legal transactional work, and a full real estate appraisal.

Services for this feasibility study would be acquired through a Request for Proposals (RFP) process, which we would like to issue as soon as possible. This will enable me to better advise the City Council as to the actual feasibility of siting the main library at 65 Prospect Street.

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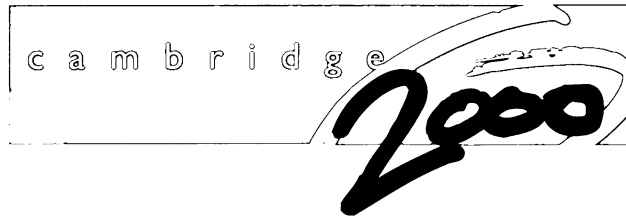
