COUNCILLOR WYLIE

- WHEREAS:** In 1977 the City Council went on record supporting the boycott against J.P. Stevens Products sponsored by the Amalgamated Clothing and Textile Union; and
- WHEREAS:** The National Labor Relations Board has continued to find J.P. Stevens guilty of widespread unfair labor practices and in three separate cases since December unanimously held against Stevens; and
- WHEREAS:** The Office of Safety and Health Administration has found that many J.P. Stevens plants frequently violate federal regulations which are intended to protect the health and safety of workers; therefore be it
- ORDERED:** That the City Manager is requested to direct all department heads and the Purchasing Agent of the city, particularly in the Department of Health and Hospitals, subject to requirements of bidding laws, to refrain from buying products of J.P. Stevens such as sheets, towels and carpeting.
