Dear Concerned Citizen:

Eighteen to twenty-one year olds now have the power to participate fully and effectively in the governmental decisions that determine their futures. Potential young voters must be made to realize this power and to react by registering to vote and by voting responsibly.

With this in mind "Youth Voter Participation" has been organized, the purpose of which is to register to vote and educate as many of the young people in Massachusetts as possible. YVP is non-partisan and is endorsed by Massachusetts Jaycees, League of Women Voters, CPP, Massachusetts Teachers Association, Massachusetts Intercollegiate Government, 18x72, NAACP, Massachusetts Association of Student Government and many other organizations and individuals.

YVP is planning a state-wide registration drive which will take place the last two weeks of April. The drive will consist of a grass roots operation, whereby we will try to have contacts in each town, high school and college throughout the state. There will also be a state-wide advertising campaign which will include TV and radio spots, billboards, posters, constant news coverage and many other areas of advertising will be available to us.

Thus far YVP has set up offices in Springfield, Worcester, Lynn, New Bedford and Boston. These offices will be used for regional organization and have all been donated.

In Massachusetts there are over 600,000 young people eligible to vote, and it is our aim to contact all of these people. Our task is enormous, but with the help of all concerned citizens we will be able to achieve our goal.

We will be grateful if you would join our ranks and help get the young people registered. You can get involved by either calling our office or writing, and most important by attending one of our regional meetings.

We thank you for your time, and look forward to meeting you in the near future.
