In the year One thousand Eight Hundred and
Seventy-eight.

An Ordinance in relation to Shades and Awnings,

As it obtained by the City Council of the City of
Cambridge, as follows.

Sect. 1.

No canopy, awning, shade, shade frame or shade curtain shall hereafter be erected placed or maintained within the limits of any street unless such canopy, awning, shade or shade curtain is constructed of cloth or canvass attached to an iron frame securely fastened and supported from above, and not less than eight feet above the level of the sidewalk over which it is placed, and the person so placing or continuing to maintain the same shall at all times and in all respects conform to any directions in relation to the construction and maintenance thereof which shall be given by the Mayor and Aldermen.

Sect. 2.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance or any such direction of the Mayor and Aldermen, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty dollars, and to a like penalty for every day that such canopy, awning, shade, shade frame or shade curtain shall be so maintained,
