At Columbia and Hampshire Streets"

This intersection was one of the twelve (12) in the City of Cambridge that did not meet the requirements set forth by the state to prohibit right turns on red. We have been told by the state that we should reevaluate all our intersections with a view toward removing some of these restrictions.

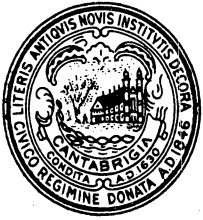
It is the federal government's opinion that we have too many intersections where right turns on red are restricted, and this does not meet their standards.

I will however resubmit a request to the state for this restriction but I question whether they will reconsider this restriction.

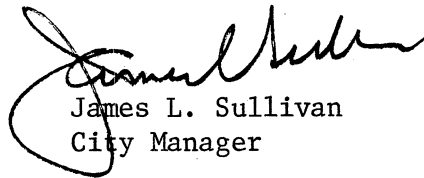
