WHEREAS: This years event entitled: "The Holocaust: Connecting to Today's Voices for Justice and Humanity" will affirm the horrible nature of the events in Nazi German of fifty years ago, but also to acknowledge the many people who are experiencing persecution or who are fighting for justice and humanity in our world; and

WHEREAS: A committee has been working to plan this year's event that includes: Cathy Hoffman from the Peace Commission, Marty Federman from Temple Beth Shalom, Cecile Williams from the Mayor's Office, Hilda Silverman from Harvard's program on Middle Eastern Studies, Jim Field from the Multi-Cultural Art Center, Lindsay McCoy from the Arts Council, and Susan Fleischman from CCTV; and

WHEREAS: This is an important event in not only recognizing a very tragic and painful part of Jewish history, but also in recognizing the need for understanding and healing on the part of people's of the multitude of different backgrounds that comprise our community as a whole; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council recognize the significance of this event on April 7, and to encourage the participation of all members of the Cambridge community.

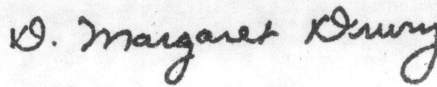
