Dear Sir:-

In accordance with the provisions of Section 26 of Chapter 31 of the General Laws, you are hereby notified that the City Council will hold a hearing on the 26th day of December, 1922, at eight o'clock and thirty minutes P. M. in the City Council Chamber, at City Hall, Cambridge, relative to the following charges which have been brought against you by the Chief of Police, to wit:-

Specification #1- That the said Patrolman, Mark J. Kelley, at 7.10 A. M. on November 13, 1922, did leave his route without permission of the officer in charge of the station, in violation of Rule #27.

Specification #2.- That the said Patrolman, Mark J. Kelley, at 7.12 A. M. on November 13, 1922, did deliberately refuse to go back on his route when ordered to do so by Sergeant Joseph Kelley, by replying "I won't", in violation of Rules #26- 55- 64.

Specification #3.- That the said Patrolman, Mark J. Kelley, at 7.10 A. M., and again at 8.10 A. M., on November 13, 1922, did by his speech and behavior, show disrespect to Sergeant Kelley, by telling him he lied, and otherwise, in violation of rules #55- 71.

I further notify you that at the time and place designated above you may appear and be heard. The Chief of Police recommends that the said Patrolman, Mark J. Kelley, be suspended from duty for a period of thirty (30) days with loss of pay.

WHEREAS:-

In agreement with the provisions of Section 26 of Chapter 31 of the General Laws, an order was adopted at a meeting of the City Council held on December 12th, 1922, authorizing a hearing to be given to Mark J. Kelley, a Patrolman in the Police Department, on Tuesday, December 26th, 1922 at 8.30 o'clock P. M., upon charges made by the Chief of Police against the said Mark J. Kelley for violation of General Rules and Regulations of the Police Force, to wit:-

Specification #1.- That the said Patrolman, Mark J. Kelley, at 7.10 A. M. on November 13, 1922, did leave his route without permission of the officer in charge of the Station, in violation of Rule #27.

Dear Sir:-

I hereby Charge Mark J. Kelley a Patrolman in the Police Department, and a Veteran, with violation of the General Rules and Regulations governing the Police Force, to wit: Neglect of Duty and insubordination and disrespect to a superior officer:

Specification #-1 That the said patrolman at 7:10 A.M. on November 13th., 1922 did leave his route without permission of the officer in charge of the station, in violation of rule #-27.

Specification #-2 That the said patrolman at 7:12 A.M. on November 13th., 1922 did deliberately refuse to go back on his route, when ordered to do so by Sergeant Joseph Kelly, by replying "I won't" in violation of rules 26-55-64.

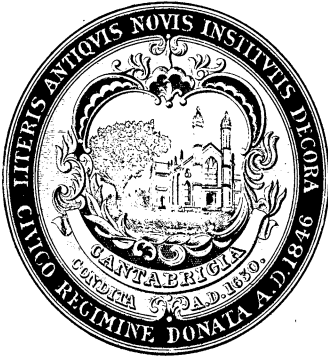
Specification #-3 That the said patrolman at 7:10 A.M. and again at 8:10 A.M. on November 13th., 1922 did by his speech and behavior show disrespect to Sergeant Kelly by telling him he lied, and otherwise, in violation of rules 55-71.

I recommend that the said patrolman Mark J. Kelley be suspended from duty for a term of thirty (30) days with loss of pay.

I request your Honor to forward this report to the City Council with a recommendation that the City Council take necessary action under the provision of Section 26 of Chapter 31 of the General Laws.
