The Committee on Roads and Bridges to which was referred the Petition of Francis Wade and others, being all the owners of land on that part of Orchard Street lying Easterly of Beech Street, that that part of said Orchard Street may be accepted and laid out as a public highway, has considered the subject, and would respectfully Report:-

That, in consequence of the reconstruction on said Street, the objections which have heretofore existed to accepting and laying out the same, have been removed.

The adoption of the Order, herewith submitted, is accordingly recommended.

To the Honorable,
The Mayor & Aldermen of the City of Cambridge.

The undersigned respectfully represent that in 1860, a Petition for the grading and accepting of that portion of Orchard St., North Cambridge, easterly from Beach St., (assessing the expenses upon the abutments,) was presented to the City.

That the City caused the Street to be graded, and levied the Tax upon the Several abutments, about the date of Sept. 1. 1860. Said Taxes have all been paid, but the Street has not yet been accepted. We therefore pray that the Street, which was laid out for a forty feet ⁱⁿ width, may be accepted, and as in duty bound, ever ever pray &c.
