Donald J. "Don" Quill of Swampscott, a lawyer, died April 14 in Massachusetts General Hospital from injuries he suffered when he was hit by a car while cycling in Topsfield. He was 43.

Born in Schenectady, N.Y., Mr. Quill was raised in Marblehead and graduated from Columbia University in 1980. He later attended Northeastern University School of Law.

Mr. Quill was a partner with the Rubin and Rudman law firm, where he specialized in commercial real estate leasing and financing, working on the Rowes Wharf, South Station, World Trade Center hotel and 75 State Street projects.

Mr. Quill was a member of

the Boston Bar Association and former co-chairman of the legislative committee of the BBA's real estate section.

He loved sailing and taught navigation at the Boston Sailing Center.
