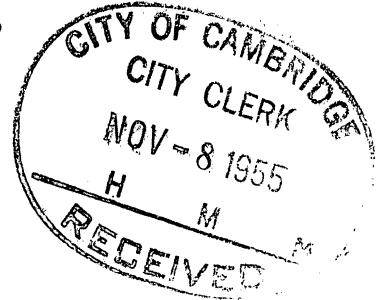

Petition of the Metropolitan Transit Authority for approval by the Department of the erection, maintenance and use of a pole to support the wires of its electrical system.

Appearance: James A. O'Neil, for the Petitioner

This is a petition of the Metropolitan Transit Authority under the provisions of section of 10 of Chapter 544 of the Acts of 1947 for permission to erect, maintain and use a pole to support the wires of its electric system in the City of Cambridge.

After notice, a public hearing was held on November 4, 1955 at which no one appeared in opposition, and after consideration, it is

ORDERED: That the Metropolitan Transit Authority be and hereby is granted permission to erect, maintain and use a pole to support the wires of its electrical system in the city of Cambridge as follows:

One (1) pole on the northeasterly side of Monsignor O'Brien Highway between the Somerville Line and Third Street

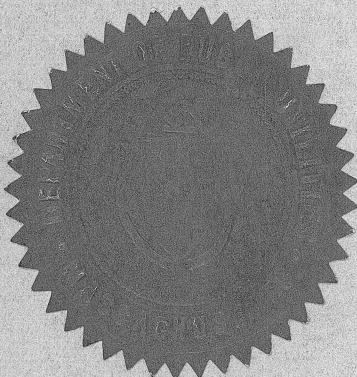
substantially as shown by red dot on plan of James A. O'Neil, Chief Electrical Engineer of the Authority, dated October 6, 1955 and filed with the petition; also that permission be and hereby is granted to said Authority to attach its wires, appliances and electrical appliances and apparatus to said poles and to make the underground and surface alterations to the street necessary for that purpose, and the Department

DETERMINES the above-described grant of location to be in the public interest.

An appeal as to matters of law from any final decision, order or ruling of the commission may be taken to the supreme judicial court by an aggrieved party in interest by the filing of a written petition praying that the order of the commission be modified or set aside in whole or in part.

Such petition for appeal shall be filed with the secretary of the commission within twenty days after the date of the decision, order or ruling of the commission, or within such further time as the commission may allow upon request filed prior to the expiration of the twenty days after said decision, order or ruling.
