WHEREAS: In 1990, the City Council enacted the Interim Parking Freeze Ordinance; and

WHEREAS: In 1992, the City Council enacted the Vehicle Trip Reduction Ordinance; and

WHEREAS: In 1992, the City petitioned the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to amend the State Implementation Plan (SIP) ~~to encourage other communities to join Cambridge in efforts to reduce Automobile traffic; and~~

WHEREAS: In 1995, inaction of the DEP towards meeting this goal occasioned the Cambridge City Council to direct the City Manager to consult with the Law Department to take whatever action necessary to accomplish this amendment of the SIP; and

WHEREAS: In lieu of a regional approach, the DEP is now considering ^{amending the SIP} ~~a policy~~ to replace Cambridge's Commercial Parking Freeze by utilizing the city's Vehicle Trip Reduction Program to off-set the increased auto traffic associated with the addition of new commercial parking spaces in the city; and

WHEREAS: Adoption of this ^{SIP amendment} ~~policy~~ will create the need for ^{the City Council to amend or rescind} ~~an amendment to or rescission of~~ the existing Interim Parking Freeze Ordinance ~~by the City Council~~; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to provide the City Council all relevant information about what performance standards, monitoring data, and other information will be used by the city to monitor the efficacy of the VTRP and that he further assist the City Council in preparation for its consideration of any changes to the Interim Parking Freeze Ordinance.
