

Memorandum of a contract made by and between James W. Kidney and Albert A. Libby, copartners under the style of Kidney & Libby, and having a place of business in Boston in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and the City of Cambridge a municipal corporation legally established in said Commonwealth.

The said Kidney & Libby agree to furnish and deliver to said City of Cambridge in such quantities and at such times during the current year and at such places upon the streets of said City of Cambridge as may be required by the Superintendent of Streets of said City of Cambridge for the time being, one thousand linear feet (more or less as may be so required) of granite edgestones. Said edgestones are to be satisfactory to the Committee on Roads and Bridges for the time being of said Cambridge and to the said Superintendent and are to be of average length. And no stone is to be less than six

feet in length. The stones are to be eighteen inches deep, the upper seven inches to be turned upon the back for brick, the face to be split straight.

The City of Cambridge agrees to pay for the edgestones thus furnished and delivered at the rate of forty nine cents per linear foot.
