WHEREAS: Gay youth and their straight supporters are collaborating during the month of May to organize events and participate in the first Gay/Straight Youth Alliance Pride March in Boston; and

WHEREAS: Gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender youth are at risk for discrimination in school, drug and alcohol use and for running away from home; and

WHEREAS: 30 percent of teenage suicides are committed by gay youth; and

WHEREAS: Gay and straight youths lobbied for the passage of landmark legislation, signed into law in December 1993, prohibiting discrimination against gay and lesbian students in Massachusetts public schools; and

WHEREAS: Cambridge sponsors, through the school department, Project 10 East at Cambridge Rindge and Latin School, a program of support, education, counselling and training on sexual orientation issues; and

WHEREAS: Gay and straight young people in Cambridge and across Massachusetts should be given the opportunity to show their pride and have their voices heard; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council declares the month of May to be Gay and Straight Youth Pride Month and urges the city's residents, young and old, to participate in the events planned during the month.
