- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.

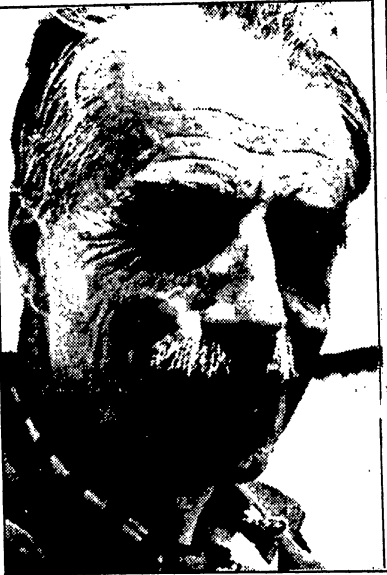

Stefan Peters, 81

Was researcher, actuary for state

Stefan Peters, an operations researcher at Arthur D. Little Inc. during the 1960s and a chief actuary with the Massachusetts Division of Insurance in the 1970s, died Thursday. He was 81 and a resident of Cambridge.

Mr. Peters was born in Posen, Germany, and received a doctorate in mathematics from the University of Erlanger. He escaped from Nazi Germany to Italy in 1933 and moved to the United States in 1938.

He served in the US Army in Europe during World War II.

He worked as an actuary in California and New York before joining the Arthur D. Little staff. He also served as an expert witness at public rate hearings.

He also taught at the University of Erlanger, University of California at Berkeley, and Northeastern and Boston universities.

He leaves his wife, Kaethe; a son, Matthew of Cambridge; a daughter, Clara Simon of Delmar, N.Y.; and nine grandchildren.

A memorial service is planned.

Good trumps can be your salvation, but like most good things in life, a trump suit comes with responsibilities.

East took the first club with the king and continued with the ace. South imprudently ruffed, led a heart to the ace and returned a heart to his queen.

When West threw a spade, declarer had to revise his plan. If he drew trumps (leaving him with none), West would cash clubs when he won the ace of spades. South therefore shifted immediately to the king of spades.
