Carter and others to the said Supreme Judicial Court, in accordance with the provisions of the One hundred and sixty-first chapter of the Acts of the Commonwealth of the year 1869.

The Petitioners are directed to cause Luther L. Parker of Cambridge to notify the several corporations hereinafter mentioned, by serving them respectively with true and attested copies of this order, thirty days, at least, before the time of said hearing, viz.: The Inhabitants of the Counties of Suffolk, Middlesex and Norfolk. The Inhabitants of the City of Cambridge and of the Town of Brookline. The Boston and Albany Railroad Company and the Proprietors of Cambridge and Brookline Bridge.

And the said Parker will make due return of his doings herein to the Commissioners, under oath, at or before the time of said hearing.

And the said Petitioners are directed to cause notice of said hearing to be published in the following newspapers three weeks successively, the last publication to be at least seven days before the time of said hearing, viz.: Dedham Gazette, Cambridge Chronicle, Boston Journal, and Boston Post.
