COUNCILLOR WALSH

WHEREAS: A resident of Jackson Gardens has advised that a less than satisfactory reply was received from Continental Cablevision to an inquiry regarding use of the remote control button to turn on and off a cable-compatible TV set. Since other cable subscribers may well have the same question and experience the same concern, the issue is raised here; and

WHEREAS: Apparently, to turn on the cable-compatible set requires turning it on both manually and pressing the remote, while to turn it off requires pressing only the remote. Sometimes, while changing channels with the remote, the off button can be hit accidentally with total loss of power which, particularly for the infirm, elderly and physically challenged, is a source of inconvenience and risk when they have to get up in order to turn the set on again with the two step process; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the Director of the City's Cable TV Office to communicate with Continental Cablevision's staff on this matter and obtain a satisfactory and adequate response as to why a single use of the remote may not be used for both; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to the City Council on this inquiry as soon as possible.
