In the year one thousand eight hundred and fiftysix

An Ordinance

In further addition to an Ordinance
"to prevent Unlawful and Injurious
Practices in the Streets and other
Public Places in the City"

Be it ordained by the City Council
of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall make,
erect, or maintain any gate, ^{or door} in or
upon any street, lane, alley, or sidewalk
in the City, in such manner as when
opening the same, it shall swing
over such street, lane, alley, or
sidewalk

Section 2. Any person who shall offend against the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be liable to the forfeitures, and may be prosecuted and tried in the manner prescribed in the Ordinance to which this is in addition

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect on and after the first day of May next
