An Ordinance  
Establishing the Salary of Inspector of Milk  
Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge  
as follows:

Section One - The salary of the Inspector of Milk is hereby established  
at two hundred dollars per annum; which sum shall  
be paid to him in equal quarterly payments, and shall be  
in full of all official services

Section Two. This Ordinance shall take effect as of the  
first day of January last
