Whereas, in the opinion of this Board, the public necessity and convenience require that *De Wolfe Street*, should be extended and laid out from its present north-easterly terminus across Mount Auburn Street to Bow Street, by taking for such purpose certain private lands as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineers, dated Dec. 6. 1886, to wit, a strip of land forty feet in width between said Mount Auburn street and said Bow Street, the boundary lines of such extension being the lines of said De Wolfe Street extended and produced upon said plan. Such extension and laying out to be made under the provisions of the statute authorizing the assessment of betterments, it is therefore hereby

ORDERED, That due notice be given to the owners and abutters on the line of said extension

and all other persons interested, ~~by~~

that this Board intends to extend and lay out the street before mentioned, by taking ~~a portion of their~~ ^{said private} lands and laying out the same as a public street,—and that

Wednesday the *14th* day of *December* next, at *8* o'clock, P. M., is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.

Resolved, That the public necessity and convenience require that De Wolfe Street, shall be extended from its present north-easterly terminus, crossing Mount Auburn Street & Bow Street, (by taking for such purpose a certain parcel of land shown on a plan prepared by the city engineer, dated December 6. 1886, said land being bounded and described as follows: Beginning on the northerly line of Mount Auburn Street, at a point where the easterly line of De Wolfe Street produced, intersects said line: thence running northerly in a straight line in continuation of said easterly line of De Wolfe Street about one hundred and eighteen (118) feet to the southerly line of Bow Street: thence running southwesterly in a curved line on the southerly line of said Bow Street to a point forty (40) feet distant, at right angles from the said line of De Wolfe Street produced, about sixty four (64) feet to Mount Auburn Street: thence running easterly on the

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northerly line of Mount Auburn Street, forty
(440) feet to the point of beginning, said parcel
of land containing an area of Thirty One Hundred
and Sixty Six (3166) Square feet, more or less; and
that the grade of the said proposed extension of
De Wolfe Street shall be established; and for
