- WHEREAS: This City Council has on many past occasions, condemned the South African government's brutal, racist, and oppressive apartheid policies, expressed support for those resisting those policies, and divested city funds from organizations doing business in or with South Africa; and
- WHEREAS: The Massachusetts Against Apartheid Committee is organizing several events this Wednesday, March 26, to commemorate "Free South Africa Day," including an anti-apartheid documentary film to be shown at the Orson Welles Cinema; and
- WHEREAS: It is essential for Americans to demonstrate their solidarity with the courageous people resisting apartheid by supporting events such as this; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council declare Wednesday, March 26, 1986 "FREE SOUTH AFRICA DAY" in Cambridge, and call upon all Cambridge citizens to observe the same by wearing a red ribbon and by supporting the Orson Welles event.
