WHEREAS:

Pope John Paul II, during his recent trip to the Far East spoke sternly in the politically repressive atmosphere of Manilla on behalf of human rights, and when he visited Hiroshima and Nagasaki appealed to the world for a moral about face as the only alternative to nuclear warfare, and on his return prayed that peace might prevail over every form of war; and

WHEREAS:

Georgetown University recently returned to Libya a \$640,000 gift to endow a professorship because, according to the Reverend Timothy S. Healy, President of Georgetown, "Libya's continued accent on violence as a normal method of international policy and its growing support of terrorism as a tool of government, has made it increasingly impossible for Georgetown University to feel comfortable in having its name associated with the Libyan Government"; and

WHEREAS:

Egypt has just become the 144th nation to sign the International Atomic Energy Agency's Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty; and

WHEREAS:

Spain has generated a wave of confidence in the future by rejecting a return of militaristic dictatorship, and a million Spainards marched through Madrid in the driving rain to underpin democracy with public action; now therefore be it

ORDERED:

That the Cambridge City Council thanks Pope John Paul II, Georgetown University, Egypt, and Spain for increasing the safety of Cambridge citizens, and a copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the parties concerned.
