Substitute for Sec 3

Sec. 3, No person shall suffer any coach, cart, truck, waggon, car, hand cart, wheel-barrow or other vehicle whatsoever of which he may be the owner or of which he may have the care, custody or control to remain in or upon any Public Square or any Street, Lane or Sidewalk in the night-time or for any unreasonable length of time during the day while the same is not in actual use

An Ordinance

In further addition to "An Ordinance to prevent unlawful and injurious practices in the streets and other public places in the City

Sect. 1 No person shall run a foot race for ~~a trial of speed, or for the~~ ^{the} purpose of contending for any prize, ^{of} money, goods, ^{or for any} medals or other compensation, or reward whatsoever; in or upon any street lane sidewalk or other public place within the City

Sect 2 It shall be unlawfull for persons to congregate in or upon any street, lane, alley, sidewalk or other public place within the City for the purpose of witnessing or giving countenance to any such foot race, so as to obstruct or prevent the free use of such street, lane, alley or sidewalk for public travel, and whenever persons thus assembled shall unreasonably refuse or neglect ^{to} depart after being

requested so to do by the Mayor or a member of the Board of Alderman or of the City Police, or ~~by~~ any civil Magistrate, every such person shall be liable to the penalties provided in this ordinance

Sect 3 No person shall leave any Coach, cart, truck, wagon, hand cart, wheelbarrow or other carriage or vehicle of which he is the owner or of which he has the custody, care or control, or suffer the same to be left so as to encumber any public square; or any street, lane, ^{or} sidewalk, or to prevent the free use of such street lane or sidewalk for the purposes of public travel

Sect 4. Any person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding twenty dollars

Be it ordained by the City
Council of the City of Cambridge
as follows

Sect. 1 No person shall run a foot
race for a trial of speed, or for
the purpose of contending for
any prize, money, goods, medal,
or other compensation or
reward whatsoever, in or upon
any street, lane, sidewalk or
other public place within
the City

Sect. 2 It shall be unlawful for
persons to congregate in or upon
any street, lane, alley, sidewalk
or other public place within

the City for the purpose of witnessing or giving countenance to any such foot race so as to obstruct or prevent the free use of such street, lane, alley or sidewalk for public travel; and whenever persons thus assembled shall unreasonably refuse or neglect to depart after being requested so to do by the Mayor or a member of the Board of Aldermen or of the City Police, or by any Civil Magistrate, every such person shall be liable to the penalties provided in this ordinance

Sec 3 No person shall leave any coach, cart, truck, waggan, hand cart, wheelbarrow or other carriage or vehicle of which he is the owner or of which he has the custody, care or control, or suffer the same to be left so as to encumber any public square, or any street, lane or sidewalk, or to prevent the free use of such

street, lane or sidewalk for the
