of the City of Cambridge.

The undersigned respectfully pray ~~that a License may be~~
~~granted~~ ~~to~~ represents that
complaints are frequently made to him in
regard to itinerant musicians, and organiza-
tions, calling themselves drum corps,
who make themselves obnoxious to quiet
citizens by parading our streets, and
being in other public places, beating
drums, blowing trumpets ~~and~~ &c.
The present ordinances of the City contain
no authority for the suppression of such
nuisances. And I wish to call the
attention of your honorable board to
the 2nd section of Chapter 136 of the acts
and resolves of the year 1875 with the
request that such action may be taken
under said act, as will give authority
for such suppression.
