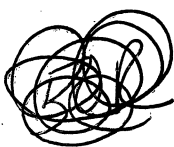

Sister Ann Murray
9/18/99 dedicated

Today September 18, 1999 we dedicate this area of Elm and Harvard Streets to a woman who gave most of her life in dedicated service to the education of youth in the city of Cambridge. Sister Anne Louise Murray, a Sister of Notre Dame gave over twenty years teaching the Junior High boys of Saint Mary's Parish. No task was too great or too small as far as "her boys" were concerned.

After the school closed in 1971, Sister Anne continued her ministry at St. Mary's for another twenty four years as the Parish Secretary. Sister Anne's warmth and generosity was felt by those who rang the doorbell at the Rectory. She made each one feel welcomed and they experienced her great kindness and generosity. Sister Anne knew so many in the Parish that she would be asked about different ones and her promise of prayers for those in need was certainly fulfilled.

In 1993 Sister Anne's health failed and she was no longer able to walk. When arrangements were made for Sister to go to the Retirement House, three firemen, who were three of her "beloved boys" carried her down the stairs to the waiting car.

Sister may have left St. Mary's in body but her heart remains here in Saint Mary's Parish in the wonderful city of Cambridge. She never forgets all those to whom she dedicated her life to, and here today her spirit is felt as she enjoys this moment from the place where she now experiences the rewards of a life well lived.

Sister Anne's sister, Katherine Murray and the Sisters of Notre Dame are grateful to the City of Cambridge for this special honor in memory of a great woman "who knew how to believe and how to love," (St Julie Billiart)
