WHEREAS: CASPAR's funding did not increase correspondingly; and

WHEREAS: CASPAR Emergency Service Center is producing a cookbook in an effort to defray costs associated with the expansion of the program and the operation of their new facility; and

WHEREAS: CASPAR is calling upon local restaurateurs, community leaders and friends of CASPAR to contribute recipes in support of its fundraising efforts; now therefore be it

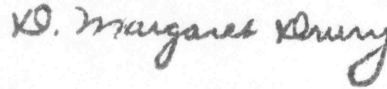

We are calling upon local restauranteurs, community leaders, and friends of CASPAR to provide us with recipes for our publication, and we hope we can count on you to submit a recipe in support of our fundraising effort. Please note that there is no cost to you except a stamp!

Please take the time to complete the enclosed form with a favorite recipe in one of the following eight food categories: appetizers, bread and rolls, casseroles, desserts, main dishes, soups, vegetables, and miscellaneous. Feel free to duplicate the form if you want to contribute more than one recipe. As you write out the recipe, be sure to follow the instructions regarding format and content. Since we hope to have the cookbook published in early 1996, we ask you to mail or return completed recipes by October 1, 1995 to Margaret McAllister at the Emergency Service Center, 240 Albany Street, Cambridge, MA 02139. Cookbooks will be sold for \$10.00 at stores and restaurants throughout Cambridge, Somerville, and surrounding towns.

Finally, I want to thank you for your participation in this important project. During the past year in our new home, guests made 32,800 visits to the Emergency Service Center, an increase of 20.9 percent over the prior year. Unfortunately, our funding did not increase correspondingly, and we ran our first-ever deficit. Sales from the cookbook will help to offset our increased expenses, and we hope you will help us in this undertaking.
