~~Ordered~~: Whereas the gravel now teamed from ~~Belmont~~ the City's bank in Belmont is not of so good a quality as formerly; and its cost, when delivered for use in the city is very much larger than (as it is believed) a better article may be procured for elsewhere; - therefore,

Ordered: That the Committee on Roads and Bridges be, and it hereby is, authorized to contract for a supply of gravel from the bank near Charles River in Ward Four, if the same can be obtained at a price not exceeding four dollars per square.
