COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

BOARD OF RAILROAD COMMISSIONERS, Nov. 12, 1889.
Whereas, by section 6 of chapter 155 of the Acts of 1882, being entitled "An Act to authorize the cities of Boston and Cambridge to construct and maintain a bridge over Charles River," it is provided as follows:

"Section 6. Said avenue may cross at grade any railroad operated by steam, and the Board of Railroad Commissioners shall, upon application of either city or any railroad corporation, prescribe the details of the crossing, and certify to the parties its decision, which decision may be enforced by proper process in equity."

And whereas, the City of Cambridge, by its Mayor, has made application to the Board of Railroad Commissioners under the foregoing section to prescribe the details of the Front street crossing over the Boston and Albany Railroad and to certify its decision to the parties interested:

The Board will give a public hearing on said application, at their office in No. 20 Beacon street, Boston, on WEDNESDAY, the twentieth day of November, 1889, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon. Per order,
