- WHEREAS: International Women's Day was originally established to recognize the contribution of women working in the labor force; and
- WHEREAS: This City Council recognizes the immense contribution of women working for the City of Cambridge as well as those working in the private sector and at home; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council hereby recognizes the many contributions of women working for the City of Cambridge and of women around the world by working for peace and justice by declaring its solidarity with others around the world to name Saturday, March 8, 1986 as International Women's Day in Cambridge; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That an engrossed copy of this resolution be presented to the women of Cambridge at the Women's Commission luncheon that will celebrate International Women's Day.
